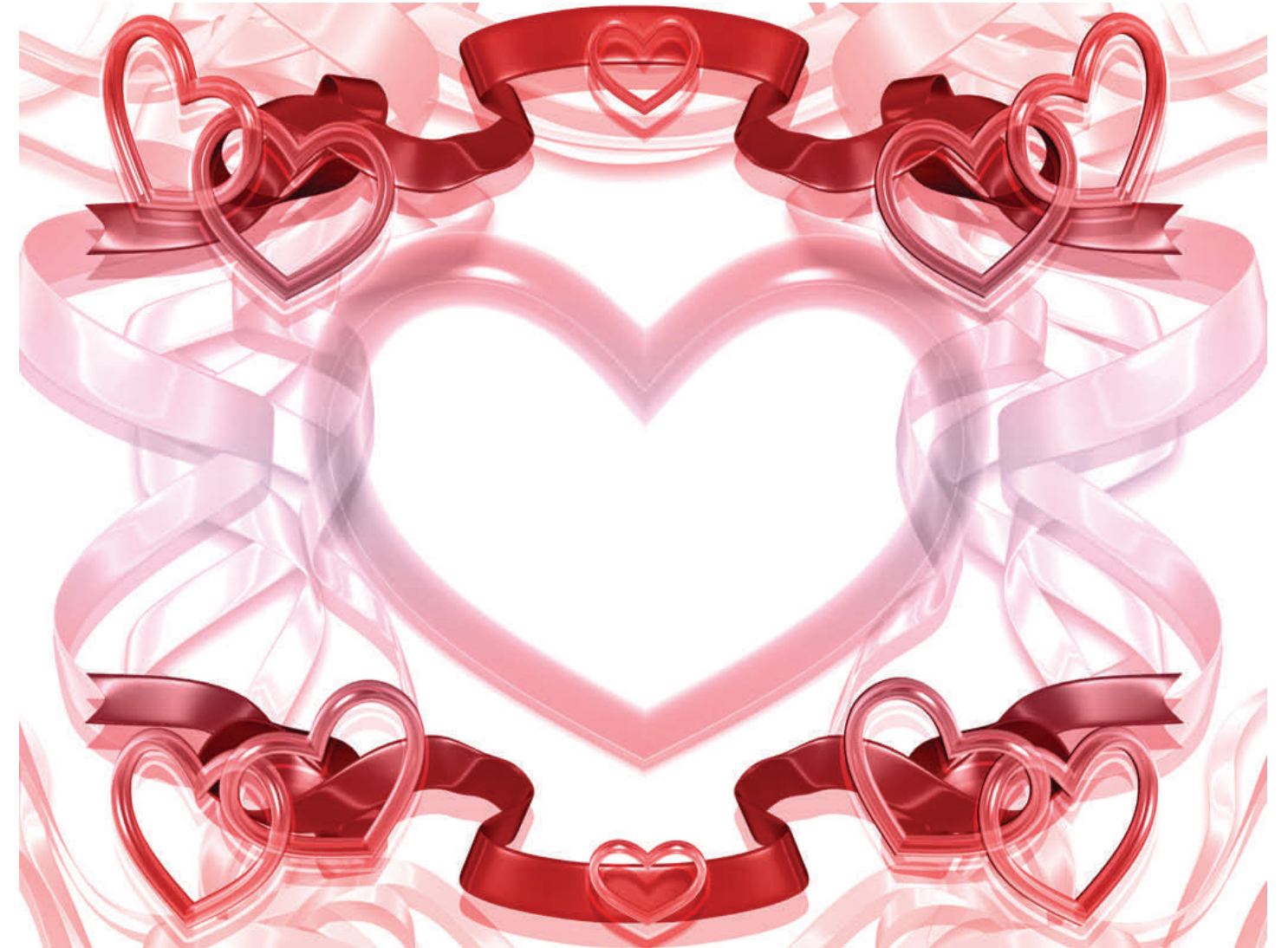

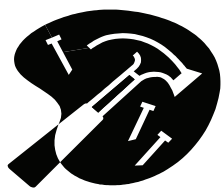

Dorothy Schoonover?

Dorothy LaRue Franklin was born in Traer, Iowa, on August 1, 1929, to Glenn and Leola (Finch) Franklin. Dorothy attended primary school in Traer, where she remembers Miss Woods, the kind Kindergarten teacher. Her favorite subject through school was arithmetic, which seemed easy to her.

The sixth of seven children, Dorothy lived in Traer until she was ten years old, when she and some of her siblings were put in an orphans home in Davenport. Later, the family moved back to the Vinton area where Dorothy attended school. She loved to swim, and one of her sisters was on the school diving team.

Dorothy's grandfather and father were both barbers and loved music. Her father played a trombone.

When she was in the tenth grade, Dorothy declared she was done with school, and found a job as a waitress in a Vinton restaurant.

She worked in various restaurants until her marriage to Daniel Poorman, an electrician with REA. Danny had three sons from a previous marriage: William, John, and Delbert. His son Bill was a photographer in the Air Force. Daniel and Dorothy had been married for seven years when Danny died from heart trouble. Not long after that, Delbert, his youngest son, also had heart problems which took his life.

A few years later, Dorothy married Leo Schoonover, who read meters for the city of Vinton. After forty-four years of marriage, Leo died of emphysema and other respiratory disorders.

In 2007, Dorothy broke her leg, and lived at the Lutheran Home for a month before moving into Windsor Manor in the fall.

She enjoys life here and cannot think of any other place she would ever want to move to.
