

Windsor Manor residents are invited to "guest judge" 4H projects on June 2nd. Local youth will present their projects at Windsor Manor. These are the actual projects they are taking to the Benton County Fair.

Judging will take place in 5 separate rooms so as not to bother someone else. Judging will run from 8am-11am, unless they get done early. The purpose is to give the presenters an audience with which to practice presenting, plus they are scored by real judges.

Presenters may be presenting in 1 or more of 5 sections:

- *A \$15 Challenge=build an entire outfit using only \$15.
- *Working Exhibit=making or doing an activity step by step
- *Clothing Selection=Outfits may be purchased from any source. Outfits must accomplish a goal or meet a cultural expectation
- *Fashion Review=Something they've made
- *Extemporaneous Speaking=They draw a topic that is related to 4H, then get 30 minutes to prepare a 15 minute speech

This experience helps them better prepare for the 2018 fair. Please join in the fun!
