good hygiene methods and drinking lots of water.

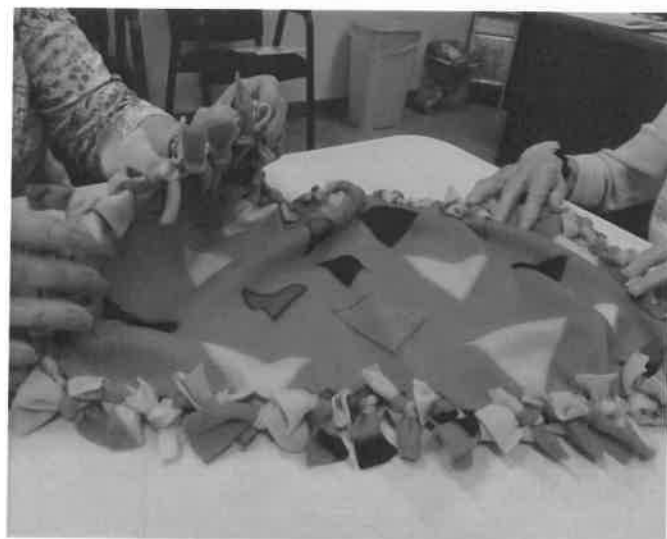
Symptoms:
